The scheme is intended to provide a framework for balancing the need to support applicants and to ensure the appropriate and transparent use of public finances. Has the scheme got the balance right? What needs to change?

The scheme does not cover all costs to progress an application. The funding matrices specify the types of costs that are funded. These costs are tied to milestones, and different amounts are available under each milestone depending on the complexity level (low to very high) of an application and through which pathway it is being progressed (High Court or Crown engagement).
